RIVONA ROCK CARVING AND RIVER CROSSING

The Rivona Rock Carvings are an ancient site tucked away in Goa's hinterlands, surrounded by forest and a gently flowing stream near the Kushavati River, which has long held sacred and historical significance in the region. The carvings, etched into laterite rock, are believed to be over a thousand years old and offer a rare glimpse into Goa's prehistoric human civilization. With no signboards or tourist crowds, the site maintains a serene, almost mystical atmosphere, making each visit feel personal and introspective. It's a meaningful stop for those seeking to explore the quieter, culturally rich inland side of Goa.

HOUSES OF CHANDOR

The Menezes Braganza House and the Fernandes Heritage Home are two historic mansions in Chandor, Goa — formerly known as Chandrapur, an ancient capital of the region long before Old Goa and Panjim rose to prominence. Chandrapur was a thriving hub of power and culture, where dynasties ruled, rivers linked distant kingdoms, and legends such as a queen's curse became woven into local folklore. The Braganza House is renowned for its grand colonial architecture, antique furniture, and the largest private library in Goa. In contrast, the Fernandes Heritage Home showcases a harmonious blend of Indian and Portuguese styles, complete with a traditional courtyard and a strong connection to local customs and festivals. Together, these ancestral homes offer a rare window into Goa's aristocratic past, preserving the region's layered cultural and historical legacy.
